Dear Mr. Maclean,

Thank-you for your letter of July 7, and for the reports. I cannot explain the star you observed near NGC 5194. No new star was reported in that region, although a 13 th magnitude extra-galactic supernova was discovered near NGC 5134. Perhaps a bit of stray light formed the image you saw.

I am pleased that your Centre will include a section on Comets and Novae in your exhibit in August. When I prepared the display for the Edmonton meeting last May, I naturally included samples of work actually done in the programme. This included completed reports of searches, photographs of comets, and drawings made of Comet Seki-Lines. However, I also included a summary of the work done by all persons taking part in the programme, and explained the programme. (Comet & Nova form #1 is suitable).

Because of poor weather, I have not located Comet Humason as yet. However, I hope to pick it up in my new 8" telescope soon. It is hoped that many observations and drawings will be reported, as I plan to write a summary of the C & N programme (including work done on Comet Seki-Lines and Humason) for the R.A.S.C. Journal.
