Herewith 35 copies of B & N Bulletin no. 4. The paper you sent me was a little too glossy to absorb the ink and the only paper I had was a little thin and unfortunately I didn't have enough to do each stencil on a separate page. I think the B & N Section has done remarkably well. It is a little disappointing that more centres aren't participating, but that will come. I'm afraid that some Secretaries are bottle necks and that much material doesn't reach the members.
