

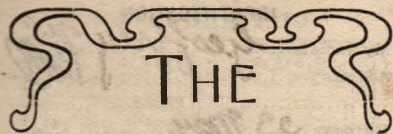

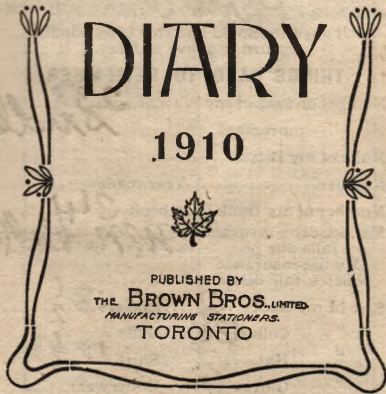

BOOKS, CIRCULARS, DOCUMENTS, &c.—Canada, per 2oz., 1c.; U.S., Newf'dl'nd, Gt. Britain, Europe, per 2 oz., 1c. Limit of weight, 5 lbs.; size, 2 ft. in length, 1 ft. width or depth; to be open at end.

COMMERCIAL PAPERS, DOCUMENTS, &c.—Canada, 2c. per oz.; Great Britain, U. S., 5c. for first 10 oz., and 1c. for every additional 2 oz.
