



International Year of Astronomy is Now Official

On December 20th the United Nations (UN) 62nd General Assembly proclaimed 2009 the "International Year of Astronomy". The International Year of Astronomy 2009 is an initiative by the International Astronomical Union (IAU) and the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).

The International Year of Astronomy (IYA2009) will be a global celebration of astronomy and its contributions to society and culture, highlighted by the 400th anniversary of the first use of an astronomical telescope by Galileo Galilei. The aim of IYA2009 is to stimulate worldwide interest, especially among young people, in astronomy and science. IYA2009 events and activities will take place at the global, regional, and local levels, to promote a greater appreciation of the inspirational aspects of astronomy that embody an invaluable shared resource for all nations. The UN has designated UNESCO as the lead agency for the IYA2009, while the IAU will function as the implementing body. The RASC's National Council through the Society's Board Pilot Committee (BPC) is seeking proposals for projects to help celebrate IYA 2009. We encourage proposals from the Society's program-focused

committees (e.g. Education, Observing, Light-Pollution Abatement, Publications, etc.), a Centre, or a group of Centres. The RASC is providing a funding commitment of \$20,000 in 2008 for IYA related projects. It is expected that another \$20,000+ will be available for 2009. Any unused 2008 funding should be available in 2009. This funding is being provided from the **Feibelman Fund** which originated from a bequest from the estate of Walter Feibelman, a well-known US astronomer. The deadline for IYA proposals is February 29, 2008. More information is available at the RASC's <u>IYA 2009</u> [3] Web site.

- Supervise the safekeeping of the Society's securities and other monetary assets,
- In general, conduct the financial business of the Society in accordance with the direction of Council,
- Prepare and present financial reports and the annual Society budget to council

Observatory Park Initiative Greenlighted

At the request of the Observatory Park Working Group, the Council of the RASC, Toronto Centre has "greenlighted" Lord Cultural Resources (Lord) to start work on the Concept Plan and Business Case as outlined in our Prospectus. Fundraising will continue to raise the remaining \$14,460 needed while the study process gets underway beginning in early January.

Start-up activities will include development of the project plan and timetable for the interview phase as well as scheduling of the Concept Planning Workshop. Lord will be asked to schedule the delivery of their

final report as quickly as possible with a target delivery date of March 31, 2008 (to be confirmed).

In approving the preliminary work by Lord Cultural Resources, the RASC, Toronto Centre has expressed its confidence that the remaining funds required will be forthcoming early in 2008. As of December 31, 2007, the Observatory Park fundraising campaign has reached 71% of our goal or \$35,560. With further support from the local and astronomical communities we are now confident that we will meet our goal to fully fund the study.
