The new Moon is this Saturday, the 5th, and a week later there will be a triple shadow transit on Jupiter. The full Moon is on October 18th and this time we get to observe a penumbral lunar eclipse. It begins at 21:50 U.T and ends at 1:49 U.T. Eastern Canada will see the entire event, whereas the rest of Canada will see moonrise with the eclipse already in progress. Call for Nominations for RASC National Awards

Please look within your Centre, and among our unattached members, for those bright and shining stars that deserve recognition. Now is the time! Nominations are due on 2013 December 31.

RASC National Awards

The RASC sponsors several annual national awards that recognize achievement or service by our members. These awards include:

- The **Chant Medal** is awarded, not more than once a year, to an amateur astronomer resident in Canada on the basis of the value of the work carried out in astronomy and closely allied fields, for original investigation, and specifically not for services to the Society, worthy though these may be.
- The **Ken Chilton Prize** is awarded annually to an amateur astronomer resident in Canada, in recognition of a significant piece of astronomical work carried out or published recently.


- The **Qilak Award for Astronomy Outreach and Communication** recognizes individual Canadian residents, or teams of residents, who have made an outstanding contribution, during a particular time period, either to the public understanding and appreciation of astronomy in Canada, or to informal astronomy education in Canada, and to promote such activities among the members of the sponsoring organizations.
- The **Service Award** is given to members in recognition of outstanding service, rendered over an extended period of time, where such service has had a major impact on the work of the Society and/or of a Centre of the Society.
- The **Simon Newcomb Award** is intended to encourage members to write on the topic of astronomy for the Society or the general public, and to recognize the best published works through an annual award.

New Web site: A Small Step for Members, a Giant Leap for the RASC

Together, we celebrate the arrival of the new RASC Web site, with a successful "first light" or launch on 2013 September 26. When you click Join, Show, Renew, Donate, or select the eStore, you'll be experiencing a beautiful, clean and streamlined RASC Web site.

The site features a simplified membership experience, including support for the new Family Membership. You'll also find it easy to add Affiliate Memberships, if you wish to receive benefits of another Centre. You can also request a change to your Centre, in a couple of easy steps, to make relocating easier.

For new and renewing members, you'll find simplified choices, including recommendation of Centres near you. There's improved presentation of Centre options and choices as well, and better integration with your Centre experience. We've listened to your feedback, and now its simpler to manage your username and password. The site is more self-service friendly, with fewer calls for help. It is easier to download member documents, and it's also faster to get things done.

This is one of the largest undertakings our members have made, in response to member and shopper feedback. Behind the scenes, we recognized our old site was behind the times in business process, design, and technology. Our membership system, iMIS 10 from Advanced Solutions International was overdue for an upgrade to iMIS 15. Office staff and Web site users alike were experiencing challenges every day with the old system.

Planning for the project began in earnest in February 2013, with an assessment of the risk of skipping iMIS 15 and going to the new iMIS 20 version. A wireframe was created in May. With the conclusion of the General Assembly, plans were kicked into high gear. Budget was set and the conversion began in August, with full engagement of Ryan May and the Information Technology Committee, and our Treasurer Denis Grey.

Society office staff should be thanked and praised for their outstanding efforts throughout the project, but

especially in testing and preparation in early September. As project sponsor, your 1st Vice-President had to stay engaged, ensure we didn't run into conflicts, and to negotiate with IT providers and hold all parties accountable. We also owe a huge debt of gratitude to the Beta Testing Team of volunteers, the Centre Contacts and administration officers who assisted with Beta Testing and evaluation, and our Executive Director for her trust and patience and many late nights for all involved.

We also wish to thank our technology partners eTech Computing and Visual Antidote for their work on this project, and the support staff at Advanced Solutions International. Through the support of these organizations, we were able to leap from iMIS 10 to the brand new iMIS 20 membership system, and get to state-of-the-art at once. We expect there may be a few minor issues to clean up in the coming weeks, so please be patient, and don't hesitate to pick up the phone and call your Society's office.

We hope you enjoy the changes. Please visit the new eStore - shopping for the new 2014 Calendar and an extra copy of the 2014 *Observer's Handbook* is just a couple of mouse clicks away. Much easier than landing a spaceship!
